

# 1 Peter 4:7-11

2. Peter, in his second wave of addressing his audience challenges them on several fronts to let their actions “silence” the world around them? What are some examples of this from the text, and what would that look like today?
3. Have you ever thought about how active prayer is? Has your prayer life been more active at certain times? What benefit is trying to be communicated about prayer being both active and sober minded?
4. We have often heard that “love covers a multitude of sins”? Where is the cross reference for this text? What else would the reader understand hearing this snippet of scripture?
5. Love here is described as constant, what would the opposite of constant love for one another look like? What can be guarded against if we are serious about constantly loving one another?
6. What are some gifts that are on display in the church? According to verse 10 how are we to use these gifts?
7. In our speech we are to speak God’s words? What does this look like?
8. In our service, we are to do so from the strength provided by God? What is the benefit of heeding this instruction. What does it look like to attempt things in our own strength? Who gets the glory?
9. Ultimately, to Christ be the glory and the power forever and ever. Amen. What does this amen mean to us? Can we say amen to that tonight?
10. What stood out to you in tonight’s study? How can we use this to reach out to our neighbors?
